SMILES

COOS & BABBLES

RAISING READERS

- Offer safe things that are different & interesting to look at & tell your child about them
- Give child big, soft & safe toys to explore with mouth
- Place noisy toys & soft books next to child

BENCHMARK

 Lift head and chest when laying on stomach



LITTLE BOY BLUE

Little boy blue, Come blow your horn, The sheep's in the meadow, The cow's in the corn. But where is the boy Who looks after the sheep? He's under a haystack, Fast asleep.

COOS & BABBLES

RAISING READERS

- Gently clap child's hands together while singing rhymes
- Gently move your child's legs as if pedaling a bike while telling your child about pretend places they are visiting
- Use a foot rattle with a towel roll under the bottom of child's leg

BENCHMARK

Wiggle and kick legs



BAA, BAA, BLACK SHEEP

Baa, baa, black sheep, have you any wool? Yes sir, yes sir, three bags full! One for the master, And one for the dame, One for the little boy Who lives down the lane.

COOS & BABBLES

RAISING READERS

- Point to pictures & things while naming the objects
- Read books to child that use colorful, clear, & realistic illustrations
- Hold & move various things in front of child while talking about the object

BENCHMARK

 Follow a moving object or person with eyes



TO MARKET, TO MARKET

To market, to market to buy a fat pig. Home again, home again, jiggity jig. To market, to market, to buy a fat hog, Home again, home again, joggity jog.

RAISING READERS

- Comfort child by looking at them & using a soft & soothing tone
- Sing lullabies, songs or nursery rhymes
- Use repetition, sing same songs or read the same stories

BENCHMARK

Make cooing or babbling sounds



HUMPTY DUMPTY

Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall; Humpty Dumpty had a great fall; All the King's horses and all the King's men Couldn't put Humpty Dumpty together again.

ROLLS

GIGGLES

RAISING READERS

- Bounce child on your knee or dance with them to music
- Lay child on side and read a story to them
- Remove two legs from an activity table, set it on the floor at an angle next to child.
 Talk about the lights, colors, shapes, etc. that are on the table

BENCHMARK

Roll from back to stomach and stomach to back



MARY HAD A LITTLE LAMB

Mary had a little lamb, Its fleece was white as snow. Everywhere that Mary went, The little lamb was sure to go. He followed her to school one day. And broke the teachers rule. It made the children laugh and play, To see a lamb at school.

GIGGLES

RAISING READERS

- Expose child to people or photos of people of different cultures
- Allow child to hold book while looking at colorful pictures together
- Create a book with photos of family members, then talk about members while looking at the book with your child

BENCHMARK

Recognize familiar faces and smiles



HOT-CROSS BUNS

Hot-cross buns! Hot-cross buns! One a penny, two a penny, Hot-cross buns! If you have no daughters, Give them to your sons; One a penny, two a penny, Hot-cross buns!

ROLLS

GIGGLES

RAISING READERS

- Tell child what loud or unusual sounds are (train whistle, dog barking, etc.)
- Sing Action Songs (Wheels on the Bus, If You're Happy & You Know It, Five Little Monkeys, etc.)
- Make noises and reward child when they look in the direction of the noise (clapping & a hug, kiss or smile)

BENCHMARK

Searches or looks for sounds



JACK AND JILL

Jack and Jill went up the hill To fetch a pail of water; Jack fell down and broke his crown, and Jill came tumbling after.



3-6 **MOS**

ROLLS

GIGGLES

RAISING READERS

- Tell your child about your day
- Sing songs that use sounds & not just words (Baby Shark, Five Little Speckled Frogs, etc.)
- · Imitate child's babbles

BENCHMARK

Coos, giggles and makes lots of sounds



RING AROUND THE ROSY





RAISING READERS

- Let child explore different containers with things in them & discuss child's activities (What is in the bag? Oops! They all fell out. You're holding a blue block)
- Read books about messes (Can you do a similar activity with your child?)
- Build a tower and let child knock it down, repeat

BENCHMARK

Love to dump toys and things out of containers



DON'T WORRY IF YOUR JOB IS SMALL





RAISING READERS

- Do Finger Plays with child (Patty Cake, Itsy Bitsy Spider, Where is Thumbkin, etc.)
- Read sensory books to child (Let child touch & feel)
- Let child finger paint with thick pudding or jell-o

BENCHMARK

Use thumb and finger together to pick up little things



THERE WAS A CROOKED MAN

There was a crooked man, and he walked a crooked mile, He found a crooked sixpence against a crooked stile; He bought a crooked cat which caught a crooked mouse, And they all lived together in a little crooked house.





RAISING READERS

- Play Peek-A-Boo
- Narrate what is happening
- Let child touch safe, large things with different textures

BENCHMARK

· Recognize and look for familiar people



HEY, DIDDLE, DIDDLE

The cat and the fiddle. The little dog laughed To see such sport,





RAISING READERS

- Sing & read to your child
- Sit in front of a mirror with child while making funny faces & noises
- Take child outside to see new things & people

BENCHMARK

 Start to imitate and make sounds like real words



TWINKLE, TWINKLE, LITTLE STAR

Twinkle, twinkle, little star, How I wonder what you are. Up above the world so high, Like a diamond in the sky. Twinkle, twinkle little star. How I wonder what you are.



9-12 SIT UP ALONE
BEGINNING STEPS

RAISING READERS

- Let child pick out a book & read it to them
- Ask child where someone in the room is, asking where they are also
- Say the child's name in different tones & encourage when child responds

BENCHMARK

Respond to own name



YOU ARE MY SUNSHINE

You are my sunshine, my only sunshine. You make me happy when skies are grey. You'll never know, dear, how much I love you. Please don't take my sunshine away.



9-12 MOS **WATCH ME GROW**

SIT UP ALONE

BEGINNING STEPS

RAISING READERS

- Play various types of music
- Explore music with your child, mimic sounds you hear around you (drums from a pan and wooden spoon, crinkling paper, tapping fingers on a table, etc.)
- Dance with child

BENCHMARK

Dance or bounce to music



LITTLE MISS MUFFET

Little Miss Muffet Sat on a tuffet, Eating her curds and whey; Along came a spider, Who sat down beside her, And frightened Miss Muffet away.



9-12 MOS

SIT UP ALONE

BEGINNING STEPS

RAISING READERS

- Ask child to point to different things while reading a book
- Name different things while 'waiting' times (doctor offices, long lines, etc.)
- Point to and name body parts, make it a game (Where are your eyes?)

BENCHMARK

Point to a few objects when asked to find



JACK BE NIMBLE

Jack be nimble, Jack be quick, Jack jump over The candlestick.



9-12 MOS

SIT UP ALONE

BEGINNING STEPS

RAISING READERS

- · Move items just out of child's reach
- Have child walk short distances while encouraging them
- Walk around with child standing on the top of your feet, talk about walking

BENCHMARK

· Take beginning steps



HICKORY DICKORY DOCK

Hickory Dickory dock, The mouse ran up the clock, The clock struck one The mouse ran down. Hickory Dickory dock.



12-18 TEMPER
COMBINE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Encourage child to say how they feel and why (mad because they lost their toy or happy because they got a piece of candy)
- Tell child about how you felt throughout the day and why
- Follow through with what you tell your child

BENCHMARK

Begin showing a temper



THIS LITTLE PIGGY

This little piggy went to market, This little piggy stayed home, This little piggy had roast beef, This little piggy had none. This little piggy went ... Wee, wee, wee, all the way home!




12-18 TEMPER
COMBINE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Model pushing, pulling or taking things apart & narrate (Look daddy is pushing the broom)
- Play with child using activity boards, blocks, dolls, balls, & stacking containers
- Read children stories about building things

BENCHMARK

Push, pull or take things apart



THE ITSY BITSY SPIDER

The Itsy Bitsy spider crawled up the water spout. Down came the rain, and washed the spider out. Out came the sun, and dried up all the rain, and the Itsy Bitsy spider went up the spout again!



12-18 MOS

WATCH ME GROW

TEMPER

COMBINE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Teach simple songs that use motion (Heads & Shoulders, Knees & Toes, Open Shut Them, etc.)
 - Read the same story over & over again
- Use child's interests (If like animals, What sounds do they make? What are they called? Read a book about them. Pretend to be your favorite animal)

BENCHMARK

Use single words, gestures and use words together



TEENY TINY LITTLE MOUSEY

Teeny tiny little mousey from the barn up to the housie went upstairs to the pantry shelf found some cheese and helped himself. Nibble, nibble, nibble.



WATCH ME GROW

12-18 MOS

TEMPER

COMBINE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Ask child to show you how to do simple things (pick up a book, touch your nose, etc.)
- Have child help you & narrate what you are doing
- Use pronouns as much as possible (use 'ball' instead of 'that', etc.)

BENCHMARK

Understand simple one step directions



PEASE PORRIDGE HOT

Pease porridge hot, Pease porridge cold, Pease porridge in the pot Nine days old.



WATCH ME GROW

2 YRS

LIKES TO SAY NO

USES MORE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Use 'Copy Cat' play to have child follow two-step directions (Point to elbow then say elbow, now it is the child's turn)
- Sing in the car or have child repeat after you
- As child becomes familiar with a book, song or rhyme, pause and let them fill in the next word or words

BENCHMARK

Sing songs and say rhymes



I CAUGHT A FISH ALIVE

One, two, three, four, five. Once I caught a fish alive. Six, seven, eight, nine, ten. Then I let it go again.



2 YRS **WATCH ME GROW**

LIKES TO SAY NO

USES MORE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Point out a 'new' item every day
- · Let child hold & turn pages while you read
- Role play ideas from books

BENCHMARK

Use 50+ words frequently



YANKEE DOODLE

Yankee Doodle went to town, A-riding on a pony; Stuck a feather in his hat And called it macaroni.



2 YRS **WATCH ME GROW**

LIKES TO SAY NO


USES MORE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Ask questions about things (What does it smell/taste/feel like?)
- Be patient, let your child finish their sentences & do not interrupt them
- Add additional words to your child's sentences (If child says 'want car' ask 'you want the car?')

BENCHMARK

Put 2-3 words together in a sentence



LAZY CAT

Kitty, where have you been today? "In the meadows, asleep in the hay." Kitty, you are a lazy cat If you have done no more than that!



WATCH ME GROW

2 YRS

LIKES TO SAY NO

USES MORE WORDS

RAISING READERS

- Model 'Please', 'Thank-you', & 'I'm Sorry'
- Put your child in charge, give two options you are okay with (Do you want corn or beans with your dinner?)
- Ask your public librarian for children stories that deal with emotions & read them to your child

BENCHMARK

Love to use the word 'no'



LITTLE JACK HORNER

Little Jack Horner Sat in the corner, Eating a Christmas pie; He put in his thumb. And pulled out a plum, And said, "What a good boy am I!"





RAISING READERS

- Participate in activities at the public library
- Make believe play with your child
- Play the 'Sharing Game' (Pass an object back and forth while saying 'my turn' or 'your turn')

BENCHMARK

Play with others and share toys sometimes



MIX A PANCAKE

Mix a pancake, Stir a pancake, Pop it in the pan; Fry the pancake, Toss the pancake— Catch it if you can.



WATCH ME GROW

SORTS ITEMS

WHY QUESTIONS

RAISING READERS

- Have child help with every day sorting (putting away silverware, laundry to wash, putting away toys, etc.)
- Ask child to find similar items while reading (This is a bird. Do you see another bird?)
- Offer various items to sort (noodles, small toys, buttons) & talk about different ways of sorting them (size, color, shape, etc.)

BENCHMARK

Sort two objects that match



ROW, ROW YOUR BOAT

Row, row, row your boat, Gently down the stream. Merrily, merrily, merrily, Life is but a dream.



WATCH ME GROW

SORTS ITEMS

WHY QUESTIONS

RAISING READERS

- Make up stories together
- Name emotions (They are happy playing together, he is crying because he is sad, etc.)
- Read aloud, slowly & exaggerate sounds

BENCHMARK

 Talk in short sentences and try to tell you their feelings



RAIN, RAIN GO AWAY

Rain, rain, go away Come again another day Little Arthur wants to play.



WATCH ME GROW

SORTS ITEMS

WHY QUESTIONS

RAISING READERS

- Talk to your child about what is going to happen or has already happened during the day
- Look up answers you don't know together
- Encourage child to touch & find things in pictures

BENCHMARK

· Ask what and why questions



IT'S RAINING, IT'S POURING

It's raining, it's pouring, The old man's snoring. He went to bed And bumped his head And couldn't get up in the morning.

MATCHES ITEMS


SIMPLE PUZZLES

RAISING READERS

- Provide crayons, sand, play-doh, chalk & other various materials to write and draw with
- Have child trace large letters in books with finger while you read
- Read a story, have child draw their favorite part

BENCHMARK

Draw simple circles and stick figures

I eat my peas with honey; I've done it all my life. It makes the peas taste funny, But it keeps them on the knife.

SIMPLE PUZZLES

RAISING READERS

- Pay attention when child is talking & add 'new' information to their sentences
- Encourage the child to speak with family and friends
- Give child the opportunity to hear troublesome sounds pronounced correctly (If child struggles with /sh/ & /ch/ sounds, use words like shoes, shut & chair more often)

BENCHMARK

 Talk with words in a sentence being mostly understood



HERE IS THE BEEHIVE

Here is the Beehive
But where are all the bees?
Hiding away where nobody sees.
Here they come creeping
Out of their hive,
One and two and three, four, five.

SIMPLE PUZZLES

RAISING READERS

- Let child pick out their own clothes (Can you wear a blue shirt today?)
- Go on a color hunt (Can you find a yellow vegetable at the grocery store? Or a green sign while driving?)
- Let child help add food coloring to milk, talk about what color they are going to drink (What if you add more than one color?)

BENCHMARK

Match & name 3-4 colors



PATTY CAKE

Pat-a-cake, pat-a-cake, baker's man, Bake me a cake, as fast as you can; Pat it, prick it, and mark it with B, Put it in the oven for baby and me.

MATCHES ITEMS

SIMPLE PUZZLES

RAISING READERS

- Play I-Spy
- Cut a color or illustrated magazine page into large pieces & let the child reassemble the image (start with large pieces, cut into smaller pieces as child masters it)
- Give opportunities to play with other children

BENCHMARK

Put together simple puzzles with 5-6 pieces



LITTLE BO-PEEP

Little Bo-Peep has lost her sheep, And can't tell where to find them; Leave them alone, and they'll come home, Bringing their tails behind them.



WATCH ME GROW

PATIENCE

TALK ABOUT FEELINGS

RAISING READERS

- Vary your voice & make funny faces while you read
- Model that it is okay to express your feelings
- While watching TV ask questions (Why do you think the boy is crying?)

BENCHMARK

Can talk about their thoughts and feelings



WHERE OH WHERE

Where oh where has my little dog gone? Oh, where oh where could he be? With his tale cut short and his ears cut long, Oh where oh where could he be?

PATIENCE

TALK ABOUT FEELINGS

RAISING READERS

- Let child help plan daily activities
- Ask questions when reading (What do you think they will do next?)
- Talk about placement of objects (on, under, behind, etc.)

BENCHMARK

 Ask and answer who, what, why, when, and where questions



STAR LIGHT, STAR BRIGHT

Star light, star bright, First star I see tonight, I wish I may, I wish I might, Have this wish I wish tonight.

PATIENCE

TALK ABOUT FEELINGS

RAISING READERS

- Point out words & familiar symbols for your child to name
- See if your child can find small words (off, go, the) in books or magazines. How many times?
- Use foam letters or magnets to write words together

BENCHMARK

Recognize printed names



HOBBY HORSE

I had a little hobby horse and it was dabble grey. His head was made of pea-straw His tail was made of hay.
